Holiday Lake Betterment Committee

The core working group continues to meet monthly to bring project ideas to the table. We have respectful discussions, then present ideas to the board and schedule workdays.

Activity was delayed this Spring as we waited long for the spring rains, wind, and cold to pass before we started our projects. Of course, weed control was the first action item!

Bushes were planted on the south end of the Community Center along with a couple of perennial flowers to complete this project. Perennial Ornamental grasses and flowers were added to both the beach house and Butterflower gardens.

The sign at the North Entrance was given a facelift, with a Nautical Blue coat of color. Lighting was added. [still needs a bit of adjustment]

Establishing a Butterfly garden from seeds is a tedious task! Weeding is meticulous, but necessary. Differentiating between the new flowers and grasses from that of noxious weeds and grasses. Many will see the green mass stems, and think that it looks terrible. The process takes patience and time. It will come.

In addition, 2 existing flower beds have gained attention. [1] DOCK Park [south boat dock] has taken on a new look. We had fun with this one! [2] The Flagpole Garden has also taken a little larger shape and look. A Living Memorial - Burning Bush was donated by Joyce, in memory of her late husband Bob Harrison. A second Memorial has been ordered by Ron Donald. He has donated a bench in memory of his late wife Sally. Mulch has been placed around the flowers/bushes and will be finish with washed River Rock.



BONUS! The fish committee is proud to announce that we have re-introduced a species of fish that once used to roam these waters, Wipers! This spring we stocked 1,000 Wipers, 6-8 inches long in the main lake. These fish are unable to reproduce, meaning they will not become lifetime members of this habitat. Wipers are a cross between a striped bass and a white bass. Wipers are very aggressive fighters and tend to stay together in schools. They grow up to 12 pounds in weight and reach 24 inches in length. The state record is currently 19 pounds, 10 ounces out of Saylorville reservoir in Polk County. Bonus!

This fish committee is also very happy to announce the stocking of 600 10-inch crappie in the ponds. 300 in Andy's and 300 in Bozo's with 400 more on the way. Enjoy, fishermen!


Fishing Tips
