Roughly 3-4 weeks out from the derby our lake experienced an ice heave, sweating the brows of our committee. We came together with a commitment to the safety of our invitees. Over the next several weeks the committee diligently monitored ice conditions and weather patterns in search of "red flags". With 10-12" of safe ice spanning the entirety of the lake, minus the heave, we ultimately came to the conclusion to barricade the heave and allow the ice derby to commence. 310 entry fees coupled with raffle sales, the Holiday Lake Fish committee profited \$12,169 to use solely for the purpose of stocking fish and habitat. The first dives of 2025 are 'in the books'. Visibility is poor due to recent rains & runoff. We expect to complete about 100 dives this year, keeping pace with the past few. We are at over 400 successful dives since we started keeping count. We will continue to use the Scuba Duck surface marker to indicate Divers Down. If you are a certified diver and want to join in, contact Blake Wilkinson. Helpful hint for lost items: stop asap, triangu-

late by referencing two spots on land, estimate distance from shore and take a picture if possible. These steps greatly increase the likelihood of the recovery of an object.


Gary and I became members of the Independent Order of Foresters in 1998. This is a fraternal organization that offers members life insurance with headquarters in Canada. We chose to purchase dog and cat supplies for PALS out of Grinnell. We shopped around to get the best "bang for our buck" and landed on Menards with their 11% rebate, which we rolled back into the PALS donation. We asked the Lake community to add to this grant by donating dog or cat food and supplies. The animal rescue/shelters always seem to be full and there is no shortage of need. It is so important to help and more important to spay and neuter your pets. Please adopt, don't shop for your next pet. Lucky for us, Foresters offer this grant twice a year, so we are looking forward to continuing to help animal rescues over the next 4 yrs. This is the second year we have applied for these grants. They have other grants, larger grants but those grants are more labor intensive. -Mary Little
