The objective of this group is to assist the Poweshiek County Sheriff's department in an Emergency, specifically with the report of a "Missing Person or a Water Emergency". The Volunteers are the 1st feet on the ground when called into action, prior to the department deputies and/or EMS responders' arrival.

When a 911 call is made for either of these 2 situations, the County Dispatcher will send an ALL Call – Text message to our cell phones on their call list. There is a process that we follow to help guide our actions. Once the Sheriff's department arrives, the Volunteers immediately follow the direction of the Sheriff or Ambulance crew.

Currently, there are 41 members who have Volunteered to give of their time and efforts should the unfortunate call be made.



Holiday Lake RIZ Committee Update

Holiday Lake Rural Improvement Zone (RIZ) is a local TIFF district formed in 2010 under Iowa Code 357H with a 20-year charter. The charter will sunset on June 30, 2032. The Rural Improvement Zone's purpose is to remove lake sediment and prevent sediment from entering the lake, which ultimately will improve the water quality. There are five RIZ zones in Iowa as follows: Lake Panorama, Sun Valley, Sundown, Diamondhead, and Holiday Lake. RIZ is classified as an other government entity overseen by the Iowa Department of Management.

The Holiday Lake RIZ is managed by five trustees elected to 3-year terms. Elections are conducted by the Poweshiek County Auditor's office. Current trustees are Tom Dvorsky, President, Term Ends 2026; Rick Happe, Treasurer, Term Ends 2027; Tom Hinders, Clerk, Term Ends 2025; Todd Eiler, Term Ends 2026 and Josh Giannetto, Term ends 2027. The next elections are August 5, 2025. RIZ trustees are elected by registered voters that have full time residence at Holiday Lake.

July 9, 2024 will be the bid opening for Dredging areas of the Holiday Lake that have not yet been dredged in the past 10 years. The intention would be to start after Labor Day weekend.
